Community Land Ownership Micro-Grant Application

Food in Neighborhoods (FIN) is a community coalition that supports community efforts to build a just, healthy, and sustainable food system in Louisville, Kentucky.

FIN will use available funds to directly support community land ownership. At this time, we have \$2500 in funds available. Individual applications are eligible for up to \$500 and will be accepted on a rolling basis to be reviewed on the first of each month until funds are spent. After this initial amount is awarded, FIN's intention is to continue raising money in order to fund more projects. There is no limit to the number of times a single applicant can apply for funding.

Food In Neighborhoods is committed to assist awardees in navigating the process for obtaining land in a timely fashion. We will prioritize the following applications:

- Applications from BIPOC (People identifying as Black, Indigenous, Latinx, or Person of Color)
- Projects in South and West Louisville
- Projects that address food security and/or food justice in some way (through food growing and/or distribution)
